SCHEDULE 1

1. The provision of a special accident dosimetry service, as defined in paragraph 5 of HSE's Requirements for the Approval of Dosimetry Services under the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1999, Part 1, External Radiations, capable of assessing doses exceeding 0.5 gray from external radiations arising from external x-ray and/or gamma radiation in the energy range 5keV to 6MeV, and/or from external beta radiation from beta particle emissions of spectral energy in the range 150keV to 2.4MeV. to the whole body using the Luxel+® dosimeter.
2. Reporting to the employer the assessed dose for any individual involved in the accident or other occurrence in accordance with Criterion 16 of HSE's Requirements for the Approval of Dosimetry Services under the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1999, Part 1, (Revised 2003) External Radiations.
3. The provision for all or any of the purposes of regulations 12, 21, 22 and 23 of the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1999 of the appropriate particulars set out in Criterion 13 of HSE's Requirements for the Approval of Dosimetry Services under the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1999, Part 1, External Radiations, to the dosimetry service approved for co-ordinating dose information or making and keeping dose records for the individuals concerned as the case may be.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The accident dosimetry service referred to in paragraph 1 of Schedule 1 to this Certificate shall be operated in the manner described in the Luxel+® dosimetry system statement of Service supplied by Landauer Europe Limited with their letter dated 2nd March 2010.
2. In operating this service regard shall be had to the contents of Part 1 of Requirements for the Approval of Dosimetry Services issued by the Health and Safety Executive pursuant to the Ionising Radiations Regulations 1999.
3. The Health and Safety Executive will formally reassess the approval of the dosimetry service at intervals of five years, commencing 1st July 2010. The service shall pay the fee for formal reassessment of approval of dosimetry services as laid down in the Health and Safety (Fees) Regulations current at the time of reassessment.
4. In this schedule a reference to the statement of service shall include any amendments or revisions as may be agreed in writing by the Health and Safety Executive.
